JUSTICE

Main Aim: to help the students learn how they can bring justice to the world

Attention: Why does justice matter?

Icebreaker: If you were a news reporter for a day, what justice issue would you cover so that more people were aware of it and more people could do something about it?

Game: Guess the Celebrity. Use distorted images as an example of how things are not quite being presented the way they are meant to be.
